Each headdress will be accompanied with its very own environmental pledge and will provoke discussion about how we can love our planet amongst wearers and viewers. Headdresses will then be displayed throughout Halton to inspire and generate discussion around this highly relevant and immediate environmental topic.

These workshops are perfect for children interested in art, animals and our natural world. It is a series of three workshops, with participants attending all three in order to deeply explore this topic and produce valuable creative pieces.
